The City must submit its Annual Action Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) every year for use of federal grant funds. The City receives the following federal funding from HUD: HOME Investments Partnership Program (HOME), Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG). The Plan sets the City's strategic objectives to address housing and community development needs through HUD funding and other resources.

The City's Department of Housing and Community Resilience is responsible for the administering the programs to meet the community's needs, including activities such as housing rehabilitation, public services, public facility improvements, and increasing homeownership.

The City invites all residents to provide input on the activities and programs to be considered for this year's Annual Plan beginning October 1, 2023. We also invite comments on barriers, opportunities, and challenges you see in your community. We invite you to engage with us at various public meetings, as well as review the presentation and draft plans as they are created.
